The tranquility of a town is disturbed by the appearance of a rhinoceros running through the streets. Soon rhinoceros are everywhere and the townspeople disappear. Or do they disappear? Strangely enough, only one man is alarmed. Soon his fears turn into terror in Eugene Ionesco's comic and nightmarish vision of our contemporary world.

This production represents the first time an Ionesco play will appear on the Guthrie main stage, and it also marks the American debut of the distinguished Polish director Kazimierz Braun.
